- HES is a safe and supportive environment. Students benefit from evidenced-based social and emotional curricula and school-wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports. 2018-19 PBIS data indicate 8 out of 10 students received no more than one office disciplinary referral during the year.
- HES benefits from a supportive community and engaged families. Students have access to a Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics lab. Our instructional technology specialist collaborates with teachers to design hands-on, interactive, problem-based learning experiences that integrate inquiry, design, and real-world applications.
- HES is committed to ensuring the success of every student, every day. The district has partnered with the University of Massachusetts and the University of Minnesota to enhance and expand its multi-tiered systems of support. Students receive regular universal screening to ensure they are on track to meet or exceed grade-level expectations. Students who require supplemental support receive targeted, small group or individual instruction and progress monitoring. Teachers and administrators review student data regularly to ensure all students are on a personalized path for success.

Hopkins Academy

- 258 students in grades 7-12 with an average grade enrollment of 42 students
- Strong Foreign Language program— HA graduates achieved State of Biliteracy in 2019.
- Rich and rigorous course offerings with a wide variety of Advanced Placement offerings
- Opportunities for dual enrollment at local colleges
- Hopkins faculty encourage students to be leaders and develop strong character. Two out of the three recipients of the Hampshire Gazette's Youth Leadership Award have been Hopkins students.
- Hopkins has been awarded funding through the Executive Office of Education to create two Innovation Pathways that prepare graduates for careers in Business/ Finance and Environmental/ Life Sciences.
- Robust Athletic Program— several graduates of Hopkins Academy have successfully participated in college athletics. The athletic program and individual student athletes have received numerous sportsmanship awards. Hopkins Academy recently secured funding to renovate its athletic fields.
- Students have opportunities to participate in a range of extra-curricular activities including drama, band, chorus, equestrian club, and mock trial.
- Hopkins received a \$25,000 grant from the NoVo foundation to teach Intergroup Dialogue Facilitation
