1. Call to Order: 5:30pm: Motion: Pipczynski Second: Percy Vote: 4-0-0

2. Adjustments to the Agenda

A. McKenzie stated that the meeting will start out of order with the student representative report. Information was added to the agenda pertaining to a new program at Easthampton Savings Bank for schools. T. Brugger will be updating the committee on the status of Unit A negotiations in open session, there is no need for executive session.

3. Public Comment – No one in attendance requested to make a public comment.

4. Presentations/Discussion Items

- a. Student Representative Aisha Anjum reported that the Panama Service Learning field trip is going well. At this time participants are still travelling. Activities included work on a construction project designed to provide running water to a community school and teaching lessons (in Spanish) about environmental conservation. She went on to recognize students for their accomplishments in the Athletic Equestrian League, the High School Region 1 Science Fair, and the Middle School Region 1 Science Fair. She also reported that the Drama Club performance of "Baskerville: A Sherlock Holmes Mystery," was a success. She announced that the Hopkins Academy Spring Concert is scheduled for May 15th and HA graduation is May 30th.
- b. Website Redesign A. McKenzie informed School Committee member that IT Director Steve Bigda is working with the Collaborative for Educational Services (CES) on website redesign. She mentioned that Mr. Bigda may reach out to members from time to time on different items on redesign. The redesigned website should be launched the Summer of 2025.
- c. Field Trip Squads Abroad Guatemala Grades 8-12 A. McKenzie stated that the linked document features an itinerary from 2023 and serves to give SC members an idea of what this trip would look like in 2027. Reviewing this now will give more time for fundraising and for students/families to start saving. McKenzie stated that Squads Abroad closely monitor travel advisories and would not go where there is a travel advisory. If this occurs the destination of the proposed trip would be changed.

d. Acceptance of Donation – A. McKenzie reported that the current piano at HA is beyond repair, and that Amherst College had graciously offered to donate a Steinway Model B Piano. Per SC policy, the donation needs to be accepted by the School Committee, and the School Committee must also approve the disposition of the old piano.

- f. Food Services USDA Audit Mr. Desjardins explained that this type of audit occurs approximately every 4 years. There were a few minor findings but all items have been corrected.
- g. Superintendent Updates Information is available on the attached link. Superintendent McKenzie stated that Finance Committee member Parmar requested to be the liaison between the Finance Committee and the School Committee. McKenzie also attended an informational meeting at the Council on Aging regarding School policies, budget and programs.

 Chair Fasihuddin recognized Anne McKenzie as the recipient of the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents President's Award. The award is presented to one superintendent annually to recognize outstanding service to public education and M.A.S.S. Awardees are selected for their dedication to improving the quality of education for all students, especially those from underserved populations.
