The Special Education Parent Advisory
Council is a volunteer organization made up
of families of students with special needs
within the Hadley community. This includes
Hadley Preschool, Hadley Elementary
School, Hopkins Academy, School of Choice
students, and Hadley students at
private/out-of-district placement schools.



"...The school community of any city, town, or school district shall establish a parent advisory council on special education. Membership shall be offered to all parents of children with disabilities and other interested parties. The parent advisory council duties shall include but not be limited to: advising the school committee on matters that pertain to the education and safety of students with disabilities; meeting regularly with school officials to participate in the planning, development, and evaluation of the school committee's special education programs..."

(Section 3 of Chapter 71B MA special education law)
